15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary	
<p>The learning is not just confined to the major discipline, but customized to cater to interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary domains. The objective is to augment the knowledge base of contemporary business trends, where multitasking is evident, and interdisciplinary knowledge is a prerequisite. Interdisciplinary expertise helps establish a connecting link between academic institutions and research centers. One of the goals is to establish "Tinkering Labs" in higher education institutions catering to interdisciplinary subjects for undergraduate students. A variety of electives at both the undergraduate and postgraduate levels are offered, along with certificate courses such as Introduction to Research and Biostatistics, Human Microbiome, Tally, Remote Sensing, Cyber Laws, and more, all of which are inherently interdisciplinary. At the third-year level Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs) are provided along with Sports in the UG curriculum. General Electives, which are multidisciplinary courses, are also introduced at the third-year level, and available to all undergraduate students. Students are encouraged to participate in interdisciplinary projects, often conducted in collaboration across departments. Furthermore, students are urged to enroll in multidisciplinary courses available on platforms like SWAYAM, NPTEL, and Coursera.</p>	
16. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	
<p>The concept of the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) as introduced by the University Grants Commission serves as a digital, virtual, and online platform that facilitates the recognition, accumulation, transfer, and redemption of academic credits. The objective is to empower students by offering a learner-centric approach in their academic progress, enabling seamless mobility between different higher education institutions (HEIs), and promoting flexible and decentralized learning opportunities. With reference to the National Education Policy 2020, ABC operates as a national system that supports a learner-centric curriculum and enables academic mobility</p>	

for students. It permits transfer of credits, equipping students to design their educational journey and earn degrees, diplomas, or postgraduate diplomas through a model of multiple entries and exits, as well as anytime, anywhere, and at any level of learning. Colleges initiated registering on the National Academic Depository (NAD) portal in 2022, with students registering on the platform.

17.Skill development:

Knowledge and skills are crucial for nation's growth and economic development. The college provides a wide spectrum of skill enhancement courses, including Techniques in Food Microbiology, Immobilization, Business in Chemistry, Entrepreneurship, SPNF, Statistical Analysis using C and R programming, Field Geology, Tally, and more. For T.Y.B.Com. students there is a Project-based Entrepreneurship Development course. Language and communication skills are emphasized through specially designed courses, with the Language Laboratory assisting students in improving their language proficiency. With an objective to foster skill sets in students, the college offers various courses. Mulya Pravah provides several value education programs in order to inculcate moral values and ethics. A synergistic combination of co-curricular and extracurricular activities facilitates the development of soft skills and leadership abilities. The college also organizes numerous workshops, conferences, and seminars for the students.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

With the inception of globalization, there has been a paradigm transformation in global knowledge and economy with a significant impact on society. With an objective to familiarize students with Indian culture, it is crucial to recognize diverse cultures and identities. With this rationale, K. J. Somaiya College of Science and Commerce has introduced a one-credit course on Indian Cultural Heritage, offered by the Dharma Study Center of Somaiya Vidyavihar. Under this course, topics such as Yoga, visits to heritage sites, mythology and meditation are taught. Celebration of various Indian festivals and commemorative days enhance the spirit of belongingness to the nation. Vedic Mathematics is taught by our students to underprivileged school children.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Approach of Outcome-based Education (OBE) emphasizes on learner-centric teaching and evaluation, in which the academic transactions are designed to achieve specific objectives and outcomes. The focus is on evaluation of student performance at various levels. Taking

cognizance of NAAC requirements, implementation of OBE in a structured manner is crucial. In order to implement OBE, aspects like Program Outcomes (POs), Program Educational Objectives (PEOs) and Course Learning Outcomes (CLOs) are considered. Additionally, each department's creation of a LOCF (Liberalized Outcome-based Curriculum Framework) document is a step toward this goal. The OBE implementation was initiated in the 2020-21 academic year with a four-day faculty workshop, followed by its incorporation into the teaching-learning process. The LOCF task force was formed to guide and monitor the progress of the departments. Attainment of CLO was implemented using a direct method starting from the even semester of 2019-20. All the departments compiled the LOCF document for UG and PG courses. The Dean of Academics and the Controller of Examinations (COE) reviewed the progress of the implementation of OBE in teaching, learning, and evaluation.

20.Distance education/online education:

Fully online admissions: Existing online admissions for first year B.Sc./ B.Com. were extended to all UG and PG programs. The college organizes the activities to digitally streamline the admission process. **e-learning:** Faculty members use a combination of online and offline modes for teaching and evaluation. They utilize diverse ICT tools to upload academic materials, share e-resources and organize career-centred workshops. **Faculty upgradation:** Faculty members are regularly updated and encouraged to take part in Webinars, workshops, seminars, and conferences to improve their subject knowledge and proficiency in ICT-based teaching methods. **Diverse methods for formative assessment:** Departments adopt various online tools and methods for internal assessments at under-graduate and postgraduate levels. **NPTEL-SWAYAM center:** The college motivates students to enroll in various MOOCs available on the SWAYAM platform to augment their subject knowledge and enhance their technical skills.

1.1 - Curriculum Design and Development

1.1.1 - Curricula developed and implemented have relevance to the local, national, regional and global developmental needs which are reflected in Programme Outcomes (POs), Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs) and Course Outcomes (COs) of the various Programmes offered by the Institution.

K J Somaiya College of Science and Commerce delivers quality education through a curriculum aligned with regional, national, and global needs. It emphasizes domain expertise, communication, leadership, and analytical skills. Curriculum is designed to meet Programme Outcomes (POs) and Course Outcomes (COs). The curriculum reflects the holistic vision of NEP 2020, integrating advanced trends, and stakeholder feedback for relevance

and diligence.

Locally relevant courses such as Molecular Biology, Environmental Biochemistry, and Marine Ecology address public health, conservation, and sustainability. Regional studies, like the exploration of local plants and mangroves, equip students to address community needs. Commerce programs, including Financial Management, Taxation, and Export Marketing, focus on economic policies and trade, while Entrepreneurship Development fosters innovation and self-reliance. Open electives like national microeconomics broaden science students' perspectives while the open electives offered to commerce help them to develop technological understanding.

Courses such as Genetics, Immunology, and Endocrinology tackle global health challenges, while Medicinal Botany bridges traditional and modern medicinal practices. Programs like Environmental Studies emphasize sustainability, and Indian Cultural Heritage creates awareness of India's legacy. Internships and on-the-job training provide practical industry insights, while science courses address biotechnology, chemical industries, material science, and technology-driven sectors.

With 480 new courses introduced in 2023-24, the institution equips students with interdisciplinary skills, critical thinking, and real-world readiness, ensuring their education remains relevant, comprehensive, and impactful.

K J Somaiya College of Science and Commerce is dedicated to the holistic development of every student. The curriculum offered by most departments emphasizes gender neutrality, human values, environmental sustainability, and professional ethics. Various courses sensitize students to environmental issues and sustainability. Recognizing the global need for environmental awareness, a dedicated course on Environmental Science has been incorporated into the curriculum. This course aims to enhance students' understanding of environmental crises and equip them with essential green skills. Open electives such as Constitutional Values and Fundamentals of Human Rights, along with coursework on the Indian Knowledge System, significantly enrich the value education of students. These courses provide a platform for students to learn professional ethics along with human values, thereby fostering a comprehensive understanding of these essential principles.

In addition to academic courses, a variety of programs and add-on courses are implemented to provide soft skills, technical skills, life skills, and encourage entrepreneurship among students. The institute endorses online platforms such as NPTEL and Career Katta to facilitate the cultivation of diverse skill sets among students and prepare them to face global challenges. Co-curricular activities such as NCC and NSS reinforce human qualities of honesty, integrity, discipline, empathy, and respect for others. Departmental festivals inculcate a sense of responsibility in students, teaching them to work collaboratively in teams.

The college has implemented a comprehensive and inclusive approach to foster the academic and personal development of students. Induction programme followed by departmental orientation is conducted to familiarize students with the academic environment. A blended approach, integrating diagnostic tests and revision sessions, ensures that students are equipped with the necessary foundational knowledge.

Teachers skillfully identify and address the varying levels of understanding among students, distinguishing between advanced learners and slow learners

Formative assessments provide insights into students' progress and help identify their learning needs at an early stage. Internal assessments also serve as a reliable indicator of students' learning types.

The college promotes student engagement by encouraging participation in cultural events, student councils, and various co-curricular activities. Remedial coaching and bridge courses are offered to the students. students are motivated to pursue MOOCs on platforms like NPTEL, SWAYAM, and Coursera, enhancing their learning beyond the traditional classroom.

The college also supports students in preparing for national-level competitive exams, including NET, SET, JAM, and GATE. For advanced learners, the Honours program provides an enriched academic experience. Students are actively involved in activities focusing on soft skills and interview preparation. It develops their overall personality, problem-solving abilities, and interpersonal skills.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student-centric methods such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences:

The programs are meticulously designed with a focus on the graduate attributes recommended by the University Grants Commission (UGC). The curriculum is structured with well-defined, learner-centric learning objectives and outcomes, serving needs of students and aligning with the institutional standards.

Students are encouraged to provide feedback. This fosters an introspective review of the teaching and learning process, enabling faculty members to address shortcomings and refine their methods.

In flipped classroom, students have access to various resources, both online and offline. Additionally, the integration of ICT tools enhances students' critical thinking abilities and aids in deeper engagement with course material.

Many students have successfully published research papers in reputed journals indexed in Scopus. Internal assessments play a significant role in developing soft skills, research skills and communication skills.

Beyond academics, the institution emphasizes holistic development

through extracurricular and co-curricular activities. Departmental fests, leadership and management skill-building activities are organized to sharpen interpersonal and organizational skills. Guest lectures by eminent personalities offer valuable insights into the latest trends and innovations in respective fields.

To encourage social responsibility, students actively participate in extension activities under the NSS, NCC and DLLE. Student representatives are included in key committees such as the CDC, BOS, IQAC.

Hot potatoes: Hot potatoes is free to download multipurpose software. Jumble words, Crossword, MCQ's can be set using this software.

Licensed LMS is made available for teachers. About 10% of the teachers use MOODLE.

Padlet is an online blank wall board that could be used to collect ideas, brainstorming and sharing information.

Interactive videos can be created using Edpuzzle and assigned to the students using google classroom or moodle.

Google Drawings: It is free web-based diagramming software to collaborate and work together in real time to create flowcharts, organizational charts, websites, wireframes, mind-maps, concept-maps.

Mentimeter is a google based platform where teachers can create interactive questions and word cloud.

Faculty members adopted Flipped Learning pedagogy in teaching, learning and evaluation.

Collaborative learning strategies are used in some of the sessions where the students are given a task to work in a group.

For instant feedback on the content taught in the class, the teacher uses Poll Everywhere.

College level library subscription to the N-list program of INFLIBNET was available to the students. Remote access to e-publications and JSTOR was available through N- LIST.

2.3.4 - Preparation and adherence to Academic Calendar and Teaching Plans by the institution

At the inception of each academic year, each department designs the academic calendar and timetable. The Principal, Dean of Academics, IQAC Coordinator, Controller of Examinations, Heads of Departments, and committee conveners, collaborate to create a comprehensive academic calendar or event planner for the upcoming year. Internal Assessment: The College follows the 60:40 pattern of evaluation; internal and semester end summative examination, respectively. At UG level, in departments assessments are conducted in a diverse manner with a learner-centric approach to furnish the internal component of 40 marks at UG level. At PG level, 40 marks comprises presentations, assignments and written tests. Assignments in various forms viz., case study, review article, participation in online/ offline workshops, projects are given to the students. Formative assessments are conducted using Google form and other ICT tools.

Semester end examination question papers are set according to Bloom's taxonomy. Each question is mapped with CLO. Direct and indirect CLO attainment is calculated for each course in every semester.

PEOs are framed by collecting the inputs from parents, alumni, and employers. The PLOs were designed with global employment prerequisites, skills and competencies acquired by the students. PLO's are designed for the challenges and demands of a global workforce, equipping them with the necessary skills to succeed. PLO's and CLO's are based on six levels of Bloom's Taxonomy. The process of approving the PEOs, PLOs, and CLOs through the Board of Studies and the Academic Council ensures a formal review and validation of the curriculum. The mapping of CLOs to PLOs using a high, medium, and low scale helps in assessing the degree of alignment and ensures that each course contributes appropriately to the overall program outcomes. CLO's and PLO's are discussed by each faculty member with the students at the beginning of each semester and also during the learning process. This helps students understand the focus of the course, making it easier for them to set clear goals and work towards achieving them.

The assessment of the mapping Programme Learning Outcomes (PLOs) and Course Learning Outcomes (CLOs) enabled the monitoring of PLO achievement at the course level. The effectiveness of this mapping was confirmed through a systematic process of collecting and analyzing data on PLOs and CLOs, followed by calculating their attainment. The attainment process was carried out as follows: 1. The weighted contribution of each course toward achieving each PLO was determined. 2. CLO attainment was evaluated directly based on student performance in the End Semester and Practical

Examinations. 3. A student was considered to have achieved the relevant CLOs if they scored 60% or higher on a question, indicating sufficient understanding of the unit. The average of all CLOs was then calculated for both the semester-end and practical examinations. Finally, the overall attainment percentage for the entire course was computed. 4. Question bank has been developed by the faculty members from each department. Question papers are set according to the Bloom's taxonomy and their difficulty levels.

3.1 - Promotion of Research and Facilities

3.1.1 - The institution's research facilities are frequently updated and there is a well-defined policy for promotion of research which is uploaded on the institutional website and implemented

One of the key elements for success in the field of education is research. Through a variety of initiatives, the College takes the lead in encouraging and advancing research among its staff and students. A well-crafted research policy, research monitoring committee, and research advisory committee are in place to sustain the research component's steady expansion.

The college features six fully equipped research laboratories. High-end equipment such as a gas chromatograph, an infrared spectrophotometer, a UV-VIS spectrophotometer, a CO2 incubator, and others are available in the Central Instrumentation Laboratory.

Since 2015-16, the college library has had a subscription to N-List's Online Journals (e-Resources), which comprises 1,99,500 e-books and over 6000 e-Journals. Web of Science has been a subscriber since 2020-21, and J-GATE since 2019-20. Every year, workshops are held for postgraduate students to enable them to avail the e-resources and library facilities. The college regularly organizes programmes related to research like Plagiarism awareness, Intellectual Property Rights, etc. In the academic year 23-24 two workshops "Capacity building for international collaboration in research" and "Introductory talk on National and International funding agencies for research projects" were conducted.

The students as well as teachers are encouraged to participate in various national and international conferences, seminars, workshops etc. and support them by bearing registration charges. The college has done budget provision for the seed money for the faculty members to motivate them to take up research projects.

With assistance from the Vice-Principal and IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell), the Principal is the college's main academic and administrative leader. The Dean of Academic Affairs is in charge of all academic operations, including creating curricula, creating syllabi, and getting input from students. The Dean of Research & Consultancy, on the other hand, is responsible for encouraging staff members to engage in research, educating scholars about prospects for research collaboration, developing policies, and proposing rewards.

The next level of the organizational structure is made up of department heads and coordinators, who are essential in converting ideas into workable plans.

The institution's departments submit their budget requests annually. An Institute-wide budget is created after considerable deliberation and submitted for approval to the Finance Committee.

An internal auditor appointed by the Somaiya Trust thoroughly examines the previous six months' worth of invoices, payments, receipts, journals, vouchers, cash books, and ledger accounts.

A compliance audit procedure is carried out after the internal audit to confirm compliance with legal obligations, especially with regard to the college's operations under the Somaiya Trust.

Within the framework of the institution's financial management, these audit procedures show a dedication to financial accountability, openness, and adherence to legal and regulatory standards.

Recycling and reduction of solid waste has been a noteworthy effort of Somaiya Vidyavihar Campus. Several workshops and seminars are organized to sensitize staff and students regarding the same.

The following are the actions taken to reduce trash output:

1. Solid Waste Management

1. Curriculum:

The Curriculum has environment related modules and courses.

1. Centralized waste management system on Campus.

Trash cans are positioned in the staff rooms, laboratories, classrooms, and common spaces. The professional housekeeping agency (Cleantech) has been entrusted with collection of the segregated garbage from the departments and sending the biodegradable waste to the composting site on the campus. The rest is sent to recyclers and Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai. The campus project office keeps track of the garbage's characteristics and executes waste disposal. Recycle bins are strategically placed at the entrance to collect electronic garbage

regularly.

2. Liquid waste management

Waste water from the college's restrooms and laboratories is gathered through drainage pipelines, and sent to a Phytorid plant for recycling which treats wastewaters without using chemicals. The plants and trees on the college grounds are watered using recycled water.

Besides this, beach clean up, river clean up drives, Swachhta pakhwada, and e-waste collection drives and plastic management awareness were organised.

The curriculum is structured with well-defined, learner-centric learning objectives and outcomes, serving needs of students and aligning with the institutional standards.

Students are encouraged to provide feedback. This fosters an introspective review of the teaching and learning process, enabling faculty members to address shortcomings and refine their methods.

In flipped classroom, students have access to various resources, both online and offline. Additionally, the

integration of ICT tools enhances students' critical thinking abilities and aids in deeper engagement with course material.

Many students have successfully published research papers in reputed journals indexed in Scopus. Internal assessments play a significant role in developing soft skills, research skills and communication skills.

Beyond academics, the institution emphasizes holistic development through extracurricular and co-curricular activities. The planning and execution of the examinations for the entire academic year is undertaken by the Controller of Examination (CoE) in consultation with the Principal.

Internal Assessment: The College follows the 60:40 pattern of evaluation; internal and semester end summative examination, respectively. At UG level, in departments assessments are conducted in a diverse manner with a learner-centric approach to furnish the internal component of 40 marks at UG level. At PG level, 40 marks comprises presentations, assignments and written tests. Assignments in various forms viz., case study, review article, participation in online/ offline workshops, projects are given to the students. Formative assessments are conducted using Google form and other ICT tools.

Semester end examination question papers are set according to Bloom's taxonomy. Each question is mapped with CLO. Direct and indirect CLO attainment is calculated for each course in every semester.

Program Educational Objectives (PEOs), Program Learning Outcomes (PLOs), and Course Learning Outcomes (CLOs) illustrate a structured and collaborative approach to curriculum development and these are designed to align with the vision and mission of the institute. PEOs are framed by collecting the inputs from parents, alumni, and employers. The PLOs were designed with global employment prerequisites, skills and competencies acquired by the students. PLO's are designed for the challenges and demands of a global workforce, equipping them with the necessary skills to succeed. PLO's and CLO's are based on six levels of Bloom's Taxonomy. The process of approving the PEOs, PLOs, and CLOs through the Board of Studies and the Academic Council ensures a formal review and validation of the curriculum. The mapping of CLOs to PLOs using a high, medium, and low scale helps in assessing the degree of alignment and ensures that each course contributes appropriately to the overall program outcomes. CLO's and PLO's are discussed by each faculty member with the students at the beginning of each semester and also during the learning process. This helps students understand the focus of the course, making it easier for them to set clear goals and work towards achieving them.

2.6.2 - Attainment of Programme Outcomes and Course Outcomes as evaluated by the institution

The assessment of the mapping Programme Learning Outcomes (PLOs) and Course Learning Outcomes (CLOs) enabled the monitoring of PLO achievement at the course level. The effectiveness of this mapping was confirmed through a systematic process of collecting and analyzing data on PLOs and CLOs, followed by calculating their attainment. The attainment process was carried out as follows: 1. The weighted contribution of each course toward achieving each PLO was determined. 2. CLO attainment was evaluated directly based on student performance in the End Semester and Practical Examinations. 3. A student was considered to have achieved the relevant CLOs if they scored 60% or higher on a question, indicating sufficient understanding of the unit. The average of all CLOs was then calculated for both the semester-end and practical examinations. Finally, the overall attainment percentage for the entire course was computed. 4. Question bank has been developed by the faculty members from each department. Question papers are set according to the Bloom's taxonomy and their difficulty levels.

3.1 - Promotion of Research and Facilities

3.1.1 - The institution's research facilities are frequently updated and there is a well-defined policy for promotion of research which is uploaded on the institutional website and implemented

One of the key elements for success in the field of education is research. Through a variety of initiatives, the College takes the lead in encouraging and advancing research among its staff and students. A well-crafted research policy, research monitoring committee, and research advisory committee are in place to sustain the research component's steady expansion.

The college features six fully equipped research laboratories. High-end equipment such as a gas chromatograph, an infrared spectrophotometer, a UV-VIS spectrophotometer, a CO2 incubator, and others are available in the Central Instrumentation Laboratory.

Since 2015-16, the college library has had a subscription to N-List's Online Journals (e-Resources), which comprises 1,99,500 e-books and over 6000 e-Journals. Web of Science has been a subscriber since 2020-21, and J-GATE since 2019-20. Every year,

workshops are held for postgraduate students to enable them to avail the e-resources and library facilities. The college regularly organizes programmes related to research like Plagiarism awareness, Intellectual Property Rights, etc. In the academic year 23-24 two workshops "Capacity building for international collaboration in research" and "Introductory talk on National and International funding agencies for research projects" were conducted.

The students as well as teachers are encouraged to participate in various national and international conferences, seminars, workshops etc. and support them by bearing registration charges. The college has done budget provision for the seed money for the faculty members to motivate them to take up research projects.

With assistance from the Vice-Principal and IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell), the Principal is the college's main academic and administrative leader. The Dean of Academic Affairs is in charge of all academic operations, including creating curricula, creating syllabi, and getting input from students. The Dean of Research & Consultancy, on the other hand, is responsible for encouraging staff members to engage in research, educating scholars about prospects for research collaboration, developing policies, and proposing rewards.

Recycling and reduction of solid waste has been a noteworthy effort of Somaiya Vidyavihar Campus. Several workshops and seminars are organized to sensitize staff and students regarding the same.

The following are the actions taken to reduce trash output:

1. Solid Waste Management

1. Curriculum:

The Curriculum has environment related modules and courses.

1. Centralized waste management system on Campus.

Trash cans are positioned in the staff rooms, laboratories, classrooms, and common spaces. The professional housekeeping agency (Cleantech) has been entrusted with collection of the segregated garbage from the departments and sending the biodegradable waste to the composting site on the campus. The rest is sent to recyclers and Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai. The campus project office keeps track of the garbage's characteristics and executes waste disposal. Recycle bins are strategically placed at the entrance to collect electronic

garbage regularly.

2. Liquid waste management

Waste water from the college's restrooms and laboratories is gathered through drainage pipelines, and sent to a Phytorid plant for recycling which treats wastewaters without using chemicals. The plants and trees on the college grounds are watered using recycled water.

Besides this, beach clean up, river clean up drives, Swachhta pakhwada, and e-waste collection drives and plastic management awareness were organised.
